How have atheists tried to debunk miracles that have happened in real life?

Atheists have claimed that there: is no historical support for miracles, people were deluded in history or so-called stories have been exaggerated over time.

God says of them: The fool hath said in his heart there is no God. Corrupt are they and have done abominable iniquity (Ps 53:1).

One's argument when based on foolishness and corruption is naturally weak.

The atheist is a foreshadow of the Antichrist to come: Who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, shewing himself that he is God (2 Thess 2:4).

Men today reject Jesus' miracles (e.g. his turning water into wine [Jn 2:1–11], walking on the sea [Mt 14:25–33; Mk 6:48–52; Jn 6:15–21] or raising the dead [Jn 11:38–44]); but, in Jesus time they did not deny his miracles—It took 2000 years to do that.

The evidence for: the existence of Jesus, his life, ministry and deity is overwhelming (Mt 11:4, 23:37, Lk 16:31). What is important is for men to believe that Jesus is who he said he is (Jn 8:24).

If one is going to come to God, he must come by faith: Without faith it is impossible to please him; for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him" (He 11:6).
