I was baptized as a baby in the Catholic Church. I now attend an evangelical Church and need to know whether I can get baptized (immersion) if there is only one baptism according to The Word which I have been given?

The Holy Spirit convicts believers to act in a God-honoring way (Jn 16:8–11). If the Holy Spirit is prompting one to be baptized; then, he should be baptized without delay (Ac 2:38, 41).

The Roman Catholic Church is an apostate church (Re 3:14-22). When one escapees their false teaching (Jud 11) and believes the gospel of Jesus Christ (Ac 9:1–20), he should be baptized (Ac 2:41; 18:8).

Infant baptism as taught by Roman Catholics is not biblical (Ac 10:47). One must be saved before he is baptized and an infant obviously cannot make such a choice (Josh 24:15).

Catholics teach that their sacraments. The scriptures teach that only by confessing with his mouth and believing in his heart, is one saved (Ro 10:9-10).

Catholics encourage men to trust in them; but, the bible encourages men to call upon the name of the Lord (Ro 10:13) and be led by the spirit after conversion (Ro 8:14).

Catholics point to themselves offering false assurance (Jud 11). Christ-followers point to the Lord and offer fellowship with one another (Ac 2:1, 41) in truth (Eph. 4:5).

Baptism does not save an individual; rather, it is his first act of obedience (Matt. 28:19, 20; Mark 16:15, 16) and a sign of spiritual unity in the body of believers (1 Cor. 12:13; Gal. 3:27, 28).
