Can we pray for the health of our animals? If one of our pets is sick, will God answer our prayer for them to be healed?

God can heal pets. It's certainly acceptable for his followers to ask this of him (Nu 12:10–15). What concerns you, concerns him. He wants to be included in your: thoughts, cares and concerns (1 Pe 5:7).

God does not guarantee that his children will not experience troubles and pain; but when they do, he promises to be with them (Deut 31:6, 8). When one experiences joy, he'd like to be remembered (Lk 17:16a). When he experiences pain, God will see him though it (Ps 30:5, Eccl 3:1-2).

God knows that believers love their pets (Ps 139:2). Animals don't have a spirit (Ge 9:6); but, they do have a soul (Ge 1:21–25). Therefore, pet owners bond with their animals (2 Sa 12:3). Man, being made in God's image, is significant not as much for who he is; but for the fact that God loves him. Similarly, pets are significant not as much for what they are (Ge 1:31); but for the Christian's love for them (Ge 1:28, Pr 12:10). If it matters to you, then it matters to God.

When a pet is healed due to the blessing of medical advances and/or God's helping hand, it is right to thank him. When a pet dies, of course their owner grieves. Unfortunately, in a fallen world, this is so (Ro 5:12–19).

Animals will be present in the millennial kingdom where they will continue to bring men happiness (Is 11:6–9). At that time man and beast will live in peace.
