Can we trust the word of God? Are there errors in it?

The Word of God can be trusted (Ps 119:142, 151, 160). It is perfect (Ps 19:7). That does not mean that the scriptures did not contain minor errors (e.g. typos); but, the essential meaning of the original texts has been preserved.

God wants to be known and he has ensured that men through his word can know him (Ac 17:27).

Believers throughout the centuries have placed their trust in the Lord Jesus. Their lives are based on Christian doctrines (1 Co 15:1–4) which are designed for all men (Mt 28:18–20). Reliance on the scriptures leads to a changed life (1 Co 6:11). Christianity is founded on Christ (1 Co 3:10, 12). He is the word. The apostle John wrote: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God (Jn 1:1–2).

God can be experienced in many ways; but, he is primarily known through the scriptures. Men can rely on the living word (He 4:12) to lead and guide them through life (Ps 119:105).

Scripture is foolishness to those who are perishing (1 Co 1:18). It is received differently by individuals: To the one we are the aroma of death leading to death, and to the other the aroma of life leading to life (2 Co 2:15–16). Some have eyes to see and ears to hear; while others do not (Mt 13:16).

The Christian worldview is the most reasonable view to answer questions; such as: Who am I? Where did I come from? Why am I here? What is real? Is there a God? How should I live? Where am I going?

Those who put their trust in the Lord can know that they will be with him in heaven (Jn 14:6).
