In the second paragraph of the article<sup>1</sup> the author argues that the idea of sin<sup>2</sup> in Christian Science differs from that of historical, biblical Christianity.

If sin is not real<sup>3</sup>, then Christ died for no good reason. In reality, Christ died to set men free from their sin (Mt 1:21).

The apostle Paul struggled with the old nature (Ro 7:19). He knew that his natural body<sup>4</sup>, likened to a tent (2 Cor 5:1a), would one day be made new (vv. 5:1b, 2b, 4b–5)<sup>5</sup>

Christian Science (neither Christian nor science) is a cult (2 Pe 2:1)<sup>6</sup>.

## Matthew Slick wrote:

To the Christian Scientist, Jesus is a Way-shower. He is someone who epitomized the true principle of the Christ Consciousness, which indwells us all. Therefore, Jesus did not really die on the cross. He was not God in flesh. He made no atonement in shedding His blood (S&H, 25:6).

Christian Science teaches that man does not have a sinful nature and is a reflection of Divine Mind. To achieve "salvation," he needs only to find the true reality of understanding, as revealed in Christian Science teachings. Unfortunately, these teachings are from Mary Baker Eddy, a woman who founded the religion in the 1870's, and not from God.<sup>7</sup>

All cults and 'isms get it wrong about the person of Jesus Christ (Jn 1:1-3). Gino Geraci said, "If you get it wrong about Jesus, it doesn't matter what you get right."

Jesus was like other men yet without sin (He 4:15). He was victorious over temptation (Mt 4:1-11). Jesus--and Jesus alone--is able to help others who struggle with sin (He 2:18). He is the bridge between God and man (1 Ti 2:5). Trust in him enables one to live a victorious life (Phil 4:13) in the flesh (Ga 5:16–21). This ability is non-existent for the unregenerate man (1 Jn 5:4).

Christians, unlike those enslaved by sin (Jn 8:34) can resist Satan (Jas 4:7)8.
