## Did Eve had sex with a snake?

Satan spoke through a snake and deceived Eve (2 Co 11:3). Both Adam and Eve disobeyed God when they ate fruit from the forbidden tree (Ge 3:6): The Bible does not teach that Eve had sex with a snake (2 Pe 2:1). Adam was the father of Eve's children (Ge 4:1).

W. Phillips wrote:

Based on other scripture, it appears that the serpent's "seed" refers to those who willfully set themselves against the seed of the woman (John 8:44; Ephesians 2:2–3). The age-long conflict between the Kingdom of God and the Kingdom of Satan (Matthew 13:37–40:1; John 3:8–12) will continue until the end (Revelation 12:17). "He" that crushes the serpent's head refers to a future descendent of the woman and is a singular noun—which many Bible scholars believe is a reference to Jesus Christ.<sup>1</sup>

Early church writings<sup>2</sup> taught that David destroyed the physical seed of the giants on the earth and Jesus destroyed their spiritual seed (Ge 6:4).<sup>3</sup>
