

I would like to know if it counts as having faith if I for example say: this mountain shall be moved but inside I know that it only can be moved if God wants to or is it only faith if I believe 100% that it will be moved no matter what?

The apostle Paul¹ said that faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen (He 11:1). One is saved by Christ's blood and merit. He need only lay hold of it and continue on allowing God to do his work in and through him (Phil 2:12).

Jesus said to Thomas, "Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed (Jn 20:29)." Though the believer does not have tangible evidence today as Thomas did, one who believes without seeing is blessed (1 Pe 1:8, 9).

It is enough to know God *can* do a thing whether he will or not (Ps 21:13). One can trust that he will work for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose (Ro 8:28).

Jesus lived a life of faith even when it was difficult (Mt 26:39). He has empowered his followers to do the same (1 Co 10:13, Phil 4:13, 1 Ti 1:12; 2 Ti 4:17).

Faith is precious to God (1 Pe 1:7) even if it is small for the time-being (Mt 17:20).
