The accounts of Jesus' crucifixion are different in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Why? Also, why is Jesus's mother not mentioned more? Are there other Marys?.

Each gospel writer shared his own perspective proving the veracity of the scriptures. Had their accounts been exactly the same, the critic would no doubt accuse them of lying. Men; however, don't die for a lie (Re 6:9).

The nature of Jesus crucifixion was unrecognized before his coming (1 Co 2:7, 8) and for some; it remains unrecognized, still (Re 3:17).

Believers (Acts 5:14; 1 Tim. 4:12) have investigated for themselves (Jn 5:39, Ac 17:2, 2 Pe 1:20, 21) to see if the Bible (Ro 1:2, 3:2, 16:26) is true (Ps 119:160, Jas 1:18).

Jesus' mother, Mary, is mentioned in the scriptures (Is 7:14, Mt 1:16). Some additional Marys mentioned are: Mary, wife of Clopas (Jn 19:25); Mary Magdalene (Mt 27:56, 61); Mary, sister of Martha (Lk 10:38–42)I Mark's mother, Mary (Ac 12:12–17) and Mary, a disciple in Rome (Ro 16:6).

Jesus, not Mary, is to be the focus (Lk 2:49).
