Can a believer of Hindu gods be saved from the wrath by Jesus Christ?

No. The apostle John wrote: ""He who believes in the Son has eternal life; but he who does not obey the Son will not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him (Jn 3:36)."

Belief in Hindu gods is idolatry¹ and no idolater has an inheritance in the kingdom of heaven (Eph 5:5).

Jesus said that there is: one way, one truth and one life and that no one comes to the Father; but, through him (Jn 14:6). No other gods can save one's soul. No law, no religion, no ceremony saves an individual. Only Jesus saves (Isa 63:9; Eph 5:23). He came to the earth to save people from their sins (Mt 1:21).

There are two ways that one can go—the broad way which leads to death or the narrow way which leads to life eternal (Mt 7:13, 14; cf. Jn 10:7, 8; 14:6). Hinduism and all world religions are the former. Trust in the person of Jesus Christ is the later.

Hinduism cannot offer a sure salvation. One must come to Jesus and trust him alone (Isa 45:21,22; 59:16; Ac 4:12) for a sure salvation.

Hindus should: turn from idolatry (1 Thess. 1:9), become born again (Hos 14:1–9; Amos 5:26, 27) and exercise faith in the Lord (Ro 10:9, 10).

No individual or nation should oppose (2 Ki 19:10–37) the only true God (Jer 10:1-16). Idolaters must repent² and live a new life in Christ.

¹ Worship of other (non-existent) gods is idolatry (Ex. 20:1–5, Hos. 4:12–19).
