

*I am a weak Christian and struggle to understand things like the virgin birth and the humanity of Jesus. I have prayed to believe the truth. I am afraid of the consequences of my doubts but at the same time I have a weird calmness inside me. Wherever I am in error, I am willing to repent.*

The incarnation is evidence of Christ's deity (Ro 9:3–5). It was prophesied (Is 7:14) that Jesus, the second person of the trinity, would take on an all new nature. The Lord, conceived by the Holy Spirit (Lk 1:35): became flesh (Jn 1:14) in the likeness of man (Ro 8:3; He 2:14), was born of woman (Ga 4:4) and died in the flesh (1 Pe 3:18; 4:1) to save people from their sins (Mt 1:21, 1 Pe 3:18).

Christ's death reconciled the world to God (2 Co 5:18–21). God now reaches down to save those who will come to Him (Ro 10:9-11). Christians believe this (1 Jn 4:1–6).

Jesus is the uncreated creator (Is 40:28). There was never a time when he did not exist. The baby in the manger was 100% God and 100% man (Jn 1:4).

The Holy Spirit, the third person of the trinity, is called the Spirit of Christ (Ro 8:9) and My Spirit (Ge 6:3). He creates (Jb 33:4). All three persons of the trinity: God (He 11:3), Jesus Christ (Col 1:16, 17) and the Holy Spirit (Ps 104:30) are authors of creation.
