

I'm leaning towards Hinduism. Can you tell me what is scientifically wrong with the Vedas? So far, I found the Vedas to be far more historically and scientifically accurate than the Bible. There are discoveries in the Vedas that seem impossible with the technologies the ancients had. The Rig Veda has the speed of light, calculated to 1.5% accuracy and the real age of the Earth calculated to 3.7% accuracy. The Vedas were written somewhere between 2000 BCE and 1500 BCE and yet has these amazing scientific facts that far surpass the Bible. In addition they do not speak against the highly plausible theory of evolution or decry that homosexuals are "unnatural". It is more inclusive. Furthermore, every single Hindu I know believes in Jesus. The Vedas do not proclaim truth (Jas 1:26). They cannot provide mankind saving knowledge which leads to eternal life (Ac 4:12). Jesus said that men must be born again--not maybe, hopefully--*must* be (Jn 3:7). He said that *he* is the only: way, truth and life (Jn 14:6). He is the only hope for mankind (Pr 3:5, 6, Mt 12:17–21). Since Jesus rose from the dead (1 Cor. 15:12–56), we should listen to what he has to say about life and good living (Jn 10:10). He is our example (Phil. 2:5–11).

J. Vernon McGee called the bible God's ABC book to mankind (Ac 17:27). God will no doubt have much more to tell us when we get to heaven (Jn 16:12). For now, we are to obey his word (Ac 5:29). We are not to veer to the left or to the right from it (Pr 4:27, Josh 1:7).

Other so-called holy books may be interesting but they do not lead men to salvation (1 Co 1:18). Jesus affirmed the Old Testament (Mt 5:18, 6, 15:3, 22:31, Lk 24:44, Jn 5:39, 10:35). The Old Testament with the New are unified in God's plan for man's salvation (1 Pet. 1:9–12). Poetic books have pleasant ideas about living well but they lack divine authority (1 Pe 4:11). The prophet Micah wrote: He has shown you, O man, what is good and what does the Lord require of you but to do justly, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God (Mic 6:8). Men have no good works to offer the Lord (Is 64:6) so they must be seen by the Father in Christ's righteousness (Phil. 3:9). Christ: died for man's sins (1 Pet. 1:18, 19), satisfied God's justice (Rom. 3:25, 26), reconciled God and man (2 Cor. 5:18, 19) and offers his perfect righteousness for all who would believe in him (2 Cor. 5:20, 21).

Adrian Rogers said: "Men study science as god not the God of science." Although the bible is not a science book it is scientifically accurate.

Ken Ham wrote:

"Genesis tells us that because of wickedness God judged the world with a worldwide flood. If this is true, what sort of evidence would we find? We could expect that we would find billions of dead things (fossils) buried in rock layers, laid down by water and catastrophic processes over most of the earth. This is exactly what we observe." Christianity can be defended using: history, scientific data and intellectual reasoning. Man was meant to worship his creator not the creation which is idolatry. God said: You shall have no other gods before Me. You shall not make for yourself a carved image—any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth; you shall not bow down to them nor serve them (Ex 20:3–5).

All religions are not equally valid (e.g syncretism and/or universalism). If all religions are equally valid then Christianity is equally valid; but, Christianity says that all other religions are false and only Christianity is true (Jn 14:6). The bible say: There is a way that seems right to a man but its end is the way of death (Pr 14:12).

The bible alone has provided prophetic fulfilled prophecy. Although Satan holds the world captive by false religion (2 Co 4:4), he is not foolish enough to predict the future because he cannot control it:

Let them bring forth and show us what will happen;
Let them show the former things, what they were,
That we may consider them,
And know the latter end of them;
Or declare to us things to come.
Show the things that are to come hereafter,
That we may know that you are gods;
Yes, do good or do evil,
That we may be dismayed and see it together.
Indeed you are nothing,
And your work is nothing;
He who chooses you is an abomination. Is 41:22–24

He said: Remember the former things of old: for I am God, and there is none else; I am God, and there is none like me, declaring the end from the beginning, and from ancient times the things that are not yet done, saying, My counsel shall stand, and I will do all my pleasure (Isaiah 46:9-10).
