Bible says Jesus was without sin even as a child. Was he led by the spirit as a child so that is why he didn't sin?

The baby in the manger was 100% God and 100% man (Jn 1:1-3). There was nothing inside Jesus which would cause him to say *yes* to sin. He did not inherit a sin nature (He 4:15).

God cannot be tempted by sin (Jas 1:13). Men who sin (Ro 5:12–14) are drawn away by their own lust (Jas 1:14).

Sin requires external temptation and internal desire.

Adrian Rogers said:

It takes two to tango. The child of lust is sin and the child of sin is death. The grandchild of sin is death (Jn 10:10). There's the courtship: the consent, the conception and the completion. Sin when it is finished brings forth death (Jas 1:15)...

...Jesus didn't have an itch that the devil could scratch.¹

Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man (Lk 2:52). He was a perfect, sinless substitute provided--the seed of the woman—to die for mankind. He died for men's sin not his own (1 Pe 1:18, 19).

Jesus is the only person who kept the law. He was the only person born of a virgin (Lk 1:26–35) who could keep the law. He came to live the perfect like that neither you nor I could live (Ro 5:12–21). He could do that because he is God, the second person of the trinity (Jn 1:1-3).

Denying: Jesus' virgin birth, his deity, his humanity or his sinlessness is an attack Christ Himself (1 Jn 4:2-6).
