Why doesn't God reach out to those of different religions who wholeheartedly commit to living out their truth and believing they are serving God such as Mormons who devote two years of their lives to preach the gospel and The Book of Mormon?

Mormons¹ are cultists who teach tri-theism (2 Pe 2:1). Jesus in their view is not God, the second person of the trinity as the Bible teaches (Mt 3:16,17; 28:19; Ro 8:9; 1 Co 12:3-6; 2 Co 13:14; Eph 4:4-6; 1 Pe 1:2; Jud 1:20,21; Re 1:4,5); rather, he is spirit brother of Lucifer.

Mormons are polytheists who believe in eternal progression (e.g. like getting on an escalator). If one is better today than he was yesterday, he can progress upward and one day become a god. Mormons must know that they will never be a god. God is the crea*tor* and men are his crea*tion* (Ge 1:26–28).

The Lord Jesus existed from the beginning (1 Jn 1:1). There was never a time when he did not exist (Ps 90:2, Is 57:15). The baby in the manger was 100% God and 100% man (Col 2:9). He spoke and world leapt into existence (Jn 1:3,10; Col 1:16).

Cultists mix truth with error (Ga 5:9). One can sincerely believe that taking arsenic rather than aspirin will relieve his headache; but he can be sincerely wrong and die. In matters of eternal life and death, one would do well to discern truth from error (Jn 8:32, 2 Ti 2:15).

God reaches out to all men (Ac 17:27); unfortunately, few (Mt 7:13-14) respond in kind (Josh 24:15, Ac 2:37, 38, Ro 1:25).
