I've heard that Moses's interaction with the burning bush was actually just a DMT related experience and that that was how he thought God had spoken to him about the law. Many people have had similar divine encounters under the influence of psychedelic drug use. If that were true then Christianity and many other religions would be a hoax.

Some claim that Moses was under the influence of DMT (Dimethyltryptamine) at the burning bush (2 Pe 2:1).

Rick Strassman wrote:

The Israeli psychologist Benny Shanon has suggested that the burning bush mediating Moses's theophany (Exod. 3:2) was a type of DMT-containing acacia, whose vaporized fumes he inhaled. Or perhaps a similarly psychedelic. LDS-like compound existed in the manna that sustained the massive Hebrew camp during their forty-year sojourn through the desert.

The lack of explicit reference to mind-altering substances in the Hebrew Bible other than wine or liquor suggests that these hypotheses are unlikely to hold up under scrutiny.¹

We have good reason to believe that the Bible is true.

Regarding the call of Moses in Exodus 3:1-2² J. Vernon McGee wrote:

Moses turned aside to see why the bush was burning but was not consumed. One of the greatest proofs of the accuracy of Scripture is the existence of the nation Israel. Years ago an emperor of Germany asked his chaplain the question, "What is the greatest proof that the Bible is the Word of God? That proof is somewhere in my kingdom." Without hesitation the chaplain said, "The Jew, sir. He is the proof." He is the burning bush that ought to cause the unbeliever to turn aside and take a look today. It is amazing that he has existed down through the centuries. From the days of Moses to the present hour he has been in existence. Other nations have come and gone, and he has attended the funeral of all of them. He is still around. Israel has been in the fire of persecution from the bondage in Egypt through the centuries to the present hour. But like the burning bush Israel has not been consumed.

By the way, when is the last time you saw a Midianite? Have you seen the flag of Midian? Do you know anything about the government of Midian? You do not and I do not because Midian is gone. It has disappeared.

The angel of the Lord who appeared to Moses is none other than the pre-incarnate Christ....³
