I was reading an article that said, "Why nature loves science..." The article seemed to state that nature points to science. Does nature point to science or to God?

Darwinian evolutionists would have you believe that because men's hands look similar to those of monkeys, man evolved from some type of hominid.

Adrian Rogers said, "Not one transitional fossil has ever been found. They talk about the missing link—the whole chain is missing!"

Dr. Elizabeth Mitchell wrote:

God's designs for hands include primates both extant and extinct adapted to many different habitats and lifestyles. Such variation does not require an evolutionary explanation. Animal species do vary but only within their created kinds...Despite varying degrees of common designs shared with some apes, the human hand with its fully opposable thumb remains unique.

In their quest for human origins, if scientists really wish to see which way our fingers point, they should look neither to the trees nor to the plains but to the Creator God, who made us in His image...<sup>1</sup>

The beauty of nature reveals God's glory (Ps. 19:1–6) for those who are paying attention.

One would not look at a dog house and then a man's estate and say that the estate evolved from a dog house. Neither would one look a motorcycle and then a car and say that the car evolved from a motorcycle.

John UpChruch wrote:

We find similarities in animals and plants all over the place. Wherever you turn, unrelated creatures rhyme with similar designs to make their home in our diverse world. It's a beautiful symmetry that points to a common hand crafting everything. The intricate structures reflect the fact that there's one Maker who's a master engineer. He formed all living things out of the same batch of chemicals, for example, giving every one of them similar genetic code and similar cell structures. Human designers do the same thing—integrating similar parts in different things they design.

This masterful similarity starts at the most basic level of living organisms—right down to their genetic code. All living things have four basic building blocks called nucleotides, and in groups of three, they code for around 20 amino acids, which, in turn, are the building blocks for many, many different types of proteins. You could think of this as being similar to letters (amino acids) that make up words (proteins). Creatures from bacteria to whales rely on this same alphabet. It's a common language spoken into existence by a common Designer (Genesis 1).<sup>2</sup>

God is the creator. Nature is his creation—not to be personified. Nature worship is idolatry (Ex 20:4).
