New research shows that the brain isn't more done developing until the age of 40. Does the Quran predict this in Surah 46:15?

Muslims teach that Muhammad received divine messages from the angel Gabriel (Jibril) and these socalled truths are recorded in the Quran<sup>1</sup>. Whether Muhammad "heard" messages or not<sup>2</sup>, one thing is clear—they did not come from God.<sup>3</sup>

Surah 46:15<sup>4</sup> contains some scientific truth (1 Ti 6:20)—a clock is right twice a day. But, like all false teachings, it mixes truth with error (Ga 5:9). It is true that men grow and mature; but are Muslims "[working] righteousness of which You [God] will approve...?" They are not (Eccl 12:13).

Jesus said men will know the righteous from the wicked by their fruits (Mt 7:20). Muslims: steal, kill and destroy (1 Ti 6:20). In fact, since the time of Muhammad, Muslims have not had a peaceful border (Jn 10:10).

The Lord also said: Indeed, the hour is coming when whoever kills you will think he is offering service to God. And they will do these things because they have not known the Father, nor me (Jn 16:2–3, ESV). Islam and other false religions (Jas 1:26) fulfill this prophecy. Unfortunately, Muslims are held captive by Satan to do his will (Tt 1:13-14).

God's word is true (Jas 1:18); but: Satan (Matt. 4:6), hypocrites (Matt. 22:23–29), false teachers (2 Cor. 2:17) and the unlearned (2 Pet. 3:16) misuse the scriptures.<sup>5</sup> The Quran is filled with murder and mayhem. It is not to be trusted for anything edifying.
