

What do Oneness Pentecostals believe?

Oneness Pentecostals are cultists (2 Pe 2:1) who teach modalism¹ (e.g. God manifests himself as: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit). God does not wear: a Father hat, then a Son hat and then a Holy Spirit hat.

Historical biblical Christians teach that God is one (Deut 6:4, Mk 12:29). The Father is not the Son and the Son is not the Holy Spirit. God is one what—three whose. He is triune.

The trinity is revealed in the Old (Ge 1:1–3, 26, Nu 6:24–27, Judg 13:8–23, Pr 8:22–31, Is 6:3, 40:13, 48:16 and New Testament (Mt 3:16, 17, 28:19, Jn 14:26, 15:26, 2 Co 13:14, Ga 4:4–6).

Oneness Pentecostals are known by other names (e.g. the “Jesus Only” churches, “Apostolic Pentecostals,” the “Oneness Movement” and the “Jesus Name” Movement [Davis, 2011]).²
