I was wondering if there is anything we can learn from Steven Spielberg movies. He is my all-time favorite film director. Personality, my favorite film by him is Saving Private Ryan because I think it shows a good example of what WWII was like.

Spielberg is a fine story-teller; but, he does not have a Christian worldview (Jn 14:6). He is able to tell stories about World War II; but, he has not learned from it—namely, to humble himself before the Lord (2 Chron 7:14).

The world was supposed to notice when the Jews are out of God's will—*and have they*? The holocaust is over now; but, another one is coming when two-thirds of the Jews will die (Zech 13:8). Will Spielberg be one of them? Now is the time to repent (2 Co 6:2).

Spielberg once said that he doesn't need therapy—making movies is his therapy. There is no evidence to indicate that he has been saved (Rom. 15:8–18; Acts 15:3). Following his worldview can only lead one into a ditch (Lk 6:39). Wisdom comes from above (Prov. 9:10). It will not be found in a Hollywood movie (Eccl 10:2, Jn 10:10).

Some of Jesus' harshest words were directed toward those who did not believe that he was who he said he was (Jn 8:24). Belief is a commodity worth more than silver or gold (Ac 5:14; 1 Ti 4:12). The Psalmist wrote: The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Ps 111:10).
