I was wondering if human spirits can remain on the earth after death.

When I was younger my mom told me that God said one man was trapped in the hospital because his mom refused to let him go. Can death be delayed?

It is forbidden to attempt to communicate with the dead (Lev 19:31). Demons, if they wished to appear to men, could make themselves appear to be beautiful (2 Co 11:13-14).

## John MacArthur wrote:

Since the Prince of Darkness (cf. Luke 22:53; Acts 26:18; Eph. 6:12; Col. 1:13) masquerades as an angel of light—that is, deceptively, disguised as a messenger of truth—it is not surprising that his emissaries do as well.<sup>1</sup>

The apostle John reminded believers: "Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God (1 Jn 4)." Departed human beings do not remain on earth in a disembodied state.

The apostle Paul said: absent from the body present with the Lord—or not (2 Co 5:8). Paul said that it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment (He 9:27). Had one died in a right relationship with the Lord, he is where Jesus is at this time. Deceased individuals are unable to communicate with the living (Lk 16:26).

God may indeed delay one's natural death if he chooses to do so (Mt 9:26).<sup>2</sup>
