Is Christ the sword of the spirit? In Revelation one like the son of man has a double edged sword coming out of his mouth, so is that Christ inside someone like the son of man?

Describing Jesus' deity the apostle John wrote, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God (Jn 1:1-2)."

The word of God is compared to a sword (Eph 6:17). The apostle Paul encouraged believers to put on the "whole armor of God" to be able to withstand in the evil day (Eph 6:13). One piece of spiritual armor is the "sword of the Spirit" which is figurative for the word of God (Eph 6:17b).

The word can be used offensively to pull down Satanic strongholds (2 Co 10:4) and it can be used to defensively to fend off attacks. His word is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow (He 4:12).

In the Book of Revelation John had a vision of the Son of Man. Describing His countenance (Re 1:12–16) John wrote, "Out of his mouth comes a double-edged sword (v. 16b)." This signifies judgement (cf. 2:16; 19:5) against those who have attacked his servants.

Christians can trust the truth of God's word (Ps 119:142, 151, 160) and speak it (Jer 23:28) so that men will choose (Josh 24:14-15) to live (Mt 4:4, Phil 2:16).

The indwelling of believers is by Christ (Eph 3:14–19, Col 1:27) through the Spirit (Ro 8:9–11, 1 Co 3:16).
