

*Why do some people hate the bible so much?*

The fruit of righteousness is: goodness, righteousness and truth (Eph 5:9). Those who walk in the light produce good fruit (Mt 7:16). Good fruits do not grow on thorns and thistles (Mt 7:16). Those who walk in darkness produce bad fruits (Mt 7:16).

The apostle Paul said that heretics in the church help to reveal who is of the light and who is of darkness (Eph 5:13). Eventually the darkness of wicked men appears (Ac 13:8–11).

The apostle John wrote: This, then, is the judgment: The light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil (Jn 3:19). Men do not just find themselves in darkness. No, men love the darkness—they run to the darkness (Piper).

John wrote: For everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed (Jn 3:20). Evil men hate the light of truth. Those who love darkness rather than light—those who hate God (Jn 14:6)—will be separated from him forever (Mt. 8:12).

Many hate God because they want to be their own god (Ex 20:5-6). Wicked men hate God (Jn 15:25) and they hate his people (Ge 26:27).

Jesus said:

...They will hand you over for persecution, and they will kill you. You will be hated by all nations because of My name. Then many will take offense, betray one another and hate one another. Many false prophets will rise up and deceive many. Because lawlessness will multiply, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be delivered. Mt 24:9–13

Many have fallen away from the faith (Heb 6:4); but, those who endure to the end will be saved (Re 2:10).

The unregenerate hate the elect of God (Ac 17:26, Mt 18:14).

Jesus said:

“If the world hates you, understand that it hated Me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love you as its own. However, because you are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of it, the world hates you. Jn 15:18–19

The believer should expect hatred from the world.

John wrote:

Whoever does not do what is right is not of God, especially the one who does not love his brother. For this is the message you have heard from the beginning: We should love one another, unlike Cain, who was of the evil one and murdered his brother. And why did he murder him? Because his works were evil, and his brother’s were righteous. Do not be surprised, brothers, if the world hates you. We know that we have passed from death to life because we love our brothers. The one who does not love remains in death. Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life residing in him. 1 Jn 3:10–15

The wicked follow the way of Cain (Jud 11). They come only to: steal, kill and destroy in all they do (Jn 10:10).

Paul warned: Evil men and impostors will become worse, deceiving and being deceived (2 Ti 3:12–13); but, he encouraged Timothy: As for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed (2 Ti 3:14).
