Will Isaiah 17 the destruction of Damascus be the trigger to start the Ezekiel war?

Some prophecy experts believe that the destruction of Damascus, as prophesied in Isaiah 17, could potentially trigger or occur in conjunction with the war described in Ezekiel 38-39[1][2]. Isaiah 17:1 predicts that Damascus "will no longer be a city but will become a heap of ruins," a prophecy that has not yet been fulfilled as Damascus remains inhabited despite damage from the Syrian Civil War[1][2]. The phrase "in that day" in Isaiah 17 is noted by some experts to be associated with end times events[2]. The exact timing and sequence of these prophesied events are not definitively stated in the biblical texts[1][2][3][4]. Some interpretations suggest that the destruction of Damascus could lead to the Ezekiel war, potentially followed by other end-times events, but this remains speculative[4][5].
