

Why don't we have non-Christian sources on Jesus?

Secular authors confirmed what is written in the New Testament.

Historian Josephus, a Jew and a Pharisee, in around 93 AD wrote about Jesus' death and large following.

Additionally, the Talmud contains passages which refer to Jesus. He is not mentioned favorably.

Gentile authors (e.g. Tacitus, a Roman Historian; Lucian, a rhetorician and satirist; Pliny the Younger, governor of Bithynia and Suetonius, secretary and historian to Hadrian, Emperor of Rome) also help to substantiate early Christian beliefs.¹
