I have been divorced and I wanted to reconcile my marriage but, my partner doesn't believe in the Lord. She believes in her ancestors and pray to them for guidance for her spiritual life. After her mother passed away, she cremated her in order to keep her ashes with her. I told her that living with her and her mother's ashes in the same house goes against my faith and it will not lead to healthy marriage relationship. In response, she told me to look for a compatible Christian wife with whom I share the same faith. I want you to pray for me and help me make a decision that fulfills God's will.

Your wife\* is unable to speak to deceased individuals (Lk 16:26).

There is no prohibition from keeping ashes or mementos from a departed loved ones in the Bible.

Because the believer will be raised bodily, many Christians prefer burial (1 Thess 4:16-17).

There is no such thing as divorce. After Mark 10:9 marriage was restored to its original intent (Ge 2:18–24). The apostle Paul encouraged reconciliation (1 Co 7:10–17).

Pagan heathens leave their marriages (He 13:4) because that is what sinners do--they sin (2 Co 6:14).

Believers (Ro 8:14) can pray for their spouses to be saved (1 Co 7:14).

\* She is your wife if you have never been married (you have no living wife) and she has never been married (she has no living husband) [Lk 16:18, Ro 7:2-3].
