## **Jephthah**

Now <sup>a</sup>Jephthah the Gileadite was <sup>b</sup>a mighty man of valor, but he was the son of a harlot; and Gilead begot Jephthah. <sup>2</sup> Gilead's wife bore sons; and when his wife's sons grew up, they drove Jeph thah out, and said to him, "You shall have on inheritance in our father's house, for you are the son of another woman." <sup>3</sup> Then Jephthah fled from his brothers and dwelt in the land of <sup>d</sup>Tob; and <sup>e</sup>worthless men banded together with Jephthah and went out *raiding* with him.

<sup>4</sup> It came to pass after a time that the <sup>f</sup>people of Ammon made war against Israel. <sup>5</sup> And so it was, when the people of Ammon made war against Israel, that the elders of Gilead went to get Jephthah from the land of Tob. <sup>6</sup> Then they said to Jephthah, "Come and be our commander, that we may fight against the people of Ammon."

<sup>7</sup> So Jephthah said to the elders of Gilead, <sup>g</sup>"Did you not hate me, and expel me from

my father's house? Why have you come to me now when you are in <sup>1</sup>distress?"

<sup>8</sup> And the elders of Gilead said to Jephthah, "That is why we have turned <sup>2</sup> again to you now, that you may go with us and fight against the people of Ammon, and be jour head over all the inhabitants of Gilead."

<sup>9</sup> So Jephthah said to the elders of Gilead, "If you take me back home to fight against the people of Ammon, and the LORD delivers them to me, shall I be your head?"

And the elders of Gilead said to Jephthah, k"The LORD will be a witness between us, if we do not do acc ording to your words." <sup>11</sup> Then Jephthah went with the elders of Gilead, and the people made him head and commander over them; and Jephthah spoke all his words mbefore the LORD in Mizpah.

<sup>12</sup> Now Jephthah sent messengers to the king of the people of Ammon, saying, ""What do you have against me, that you have come to fight against me in my land?"

<sup>13</sup> And the king of the people of Ammon answered the messengers of Jephthah, o"Because Israel took away my land when they came up out of Egypt, from bthe Arnon as far as <sup>q</sup>the Jabbok, and to the Jordan. Now therefore, restore those *lands* peaceably."

<sup>14</sup> So Jephthah again sent messengers to the king of the people of Ammon, <sup>15</sup> and said to him, "Thus says Jephthah: "Israel did not take away the land of Moab, nor the land of the people of Ammon; <sup>16</sup> for when Israel came up from Egypt, they walked through the wilderness as far as the Red Sea and scame to Kadesh. 17 Then tIsrael sent messengers to the king of Edom, saying, "Please let me pass through your land." <sup>u</sup>But the king of Edom would not heed. And in like manner they sent to the vking of Moab, but he would not consent. So Israel wremained in Kadesh. 18 And they went along through the wilderness and ybypassed the land of Edom and the land of Moab, came to the east side of the land of Moab, and encamped on the other side of the Arnon. But they did not enter the border

of Moab, for the Arnon was the border of Moab. 19 Then Israel sent messengers to Sihon king of the Amorites, king of Heshbon; and Israel said to him, "Please alet us pass through your land into our place." <sup>20</sup> <sup>b</sup>But Sihon did not trust Israel to pass through his territory. So Sihon gat hered all his people together, encamped in Jahaz, and fought against Israel. <sup>21</sup> And the LORD God of Israel <sup>c</sup>delivered Sihon and all his people into the hand of Israel, and they <sup>d</sup>defeated <sup>3</sup>them. Thus Israel gained possession of all the land of the Amorites, who inhabited that country. <sup>22</sup> They took possession of <sup>e</sup>all the territory of the Amorites, from the Arnon to the Jabbok and from the wilderness to the Jordan.

<sup>23</sup> 'And now the LORD God of Israel has <sup>4</sup>dispossessed the Amorites from before H is people Israel; should you then possess it? <sup>24</sup> Will you not possess whatever <sup>f</sup>Chemosh your god gives you to possess? So whatever gthe LORD our God takes possession of before us, we will possess. <sup>25</sup> And now, *are* you any better than <sup>h</sup>Balak the son of Zippor, king of Moab? Did he ever strive against Israel? Did he ever fight against them? <sup>26</sup> While Israel dwelt in Heshbon and its villages, in Aroer and its villages, and in all the cities along the banks of the Arnon, for three hundred years, why did you not recover them within that time? <sup>27</sup> Therefore I have not sinned against you, but you wronged me by fighting against me. May the LORD, kthe Judge, render judgment this day between the children of Israel and the people of Ammon. However, the king of the people of Ammon did not heed the words which Jephthah sent him.
